**Attention “Producers”**

Representatives from the British Columbia Ministry of Agriculture will be in the Thompson and Cariboo region to discuss the recently announced 2017 BC AgriStability Enhancement Program. The British Columbia government has made special provisions to help producers suffering income declines in 2017.

This year has been a particularly challenging one for many producers across the province. The challenges include disasters like winter freeze, excessive moisture, and wildfires. The British Columbia AgriStability Enhancement Program allows agricultural producers to enroll late and without penalty into the existing AgriStability program. It also includes some enhancements to the AgriStability program but only for 2017.
